



Fox & Goose AGM - Saturday 17th May

Notes From The Cellar

An update on the Fox's beers from Andrew:

I thought we'd mark International Women's Day with some beer from one of our favourite local Breweries. Mallinsons was originally founded in Huddersfield in 2008 by Tara. Brewing duties have since been taken over by Elaine and Nick, but they continue to make great beer. I'm sure you will enjoy their US Blonde and Bitter.



We've also got a couple of casks of Wrong Sized Spacesuit. Turning Point in Knaresborough opened their doors to 60 women in the industry who helped brew this for International Women's Day. If I've got the timing right we should have it on the pumps for the official launch on Saturday.

We've a couple of dark beers in the cellar to look out for. Soulless Black IPA is the latest beer brewed to celebrate RedWillow's 15th Anniversary.

Currently planning a tap take over for mid-April to celebrate the 10th Anniversary of a brewery I came across at Bradford Beer Festival. I may have got a bit carried away, but I guess that's what happens at beer festivals. I just hope you enjoy their beer as much as (I think) I did.

Business Management Update

The staff and management team and directors got together in December for a Christmas meal and to celebrate all things Fox and Goose. For some, this was the first time they'd met so it was great to spend some time together.

The end of the year saw Board approval of the 2025 budget, including the payment of a staff bonus and implementation of the annual wage increase. January has been really busy from a financial point of view. It's during this month that all the wage changes are implemented, the backlog of invoice processing and supplier payment after the festive season takes place, and the accounts are prepared for handover to our co-operative partner Third Sector Accounting. They will then finalise our accounts ahead of the AGM in May.

We have started to work with our HR partner, People Support Co-op to develop our HR policies, and director Hana and I are currently negotiating our new insurance agreement.

Finally we're delighted to confirm that we have been short-listed for the Social Enterprise of the Year Award (Yorkshire and the Humber) in recognition of our success as a community-owned business. Many thanks to the customers and suppliers who supported our application. The event will be attended by me, Hannah and Nick, our Treasurer.

Garden Extension

We have decided to extend the Fox & Goose beer garden, with another level being added in what is a great suntrap at the top of the existing steps.



Work will begin on this in the next few weeks, with Keith Wilson and Alistair McIlroy replicating the high quality work they produced on the lower level. On the whole it is hoped this work will take place with minimal disruption to users of the pub, but be

Fox Trotters

Spring is definitely in the air, so it seems timely to highlight the Fox and Goose's walking group, led by Andy.



Hi, my name is Andy. I volunteered some time ago at the end of 2018 to help lead a guided walk from the pub one Saturday. Everyone enjoyed it so much and was so positive I've been taking groups out ever since. It's all about the spirit of the community owned pub, which we all love.

The Fox Trotters are a very informal and friendly walking group that meet on the first Saturday of every month at 10:30am in the Fox and Goose and everyone (including dogs) are welcome. We set off from and return to the pub walking 5 to 6 miles (although occasionally longer) on a circular route. We stop often to catch our breath, at viewpoints and places of interest. Weather permitting, we take a break for a flask of coffee and a snack if you have brought one. To date I've managed to make every route we have walked unique, and everyone enjoys discovering new pathways and places around Hebden. After the walk we all enjoy the excellent Fox beers with new friends and old. Walkers of all abilities are welcome. This is all free apart from

the beer at the end!

Originally it was just a message in the Fox on a chalk board but has since moved to the Fox Trotters WhatsApp group. We get lots of lovely photos of our adventures and I post about upcoming walks with estimated length and difficulty. I often enrol people onto the group when in the Fox or on their first walk but there are a few administrators who can add members including our own Hannah.

If you like walking, finding new routes, making new friends and of course the Fox and Goose wonderful staff and choice of excellent beers then come along.

Reinvesting in Other Co-operative & Community Enterprises

We are aware that, after many of you elected to forego your interest payments for 2022 so that we could reinvest them in other co-operative and community enterprises, we have had the money burning a hole in our proverbial wallet. It has taken us time to identify the right opportunities, but are pleased to announce that we have recently invested £1,000 (the original £662.10 pledged and a further £338) in a community share offer from POD. This is a new shared electric car scheme for the Upper Calder Valley and is run as a Community Benefit Society - see https://pod-caldervalley.co.uk/.

We also have plans to invest further money in a couple of other projects (more announcements on these soon) as we feel it is better to use some of the money we have sitting in the bank to invest in other local community benefit and co-operative projects.

February


